### **Fay Hunt of Maslin Beach's recollections of her honeymoon**

*My mother made my wedding dress. It was lovely. I've still got it. On our honeymoon we went to Melbourne. Yes, we went on the train – the Overland – and I lost my case with all the dresses my mother had made. It was not found for two weeks after we got home again. We did finally get it back. They left it on the train and it was up in Albury apparently. But we used to go to the Melbourne station every day to check all the baggage. It rather spoilt our honeymoon, yes it did. That was a big trip, you know, going to Melbourne as well, interstate. I had a little bag of overnight things but we had to go and buy some more things. I looked forward wearing all the lovely frocks once they were found.*

### **May Lovelock of Willunga's recollections of social life in the Willunga district**

*Well social life, there was people who might only come down for afternoon tea and having a cup of tea and a general chat, might be playing bridge, might be playing scrabble – might be playing any of those things. We used to get together as groups and we all knew one another really well and felt very much at home with one another. It was an entirely different felling to what it is today. When I was first married I very seldom went to Adelaide, perhaps two or three times as year when there was a big shopping day.*
