
15. Confidential items

15.1 Audit, Risk, Value and Efficiency minutes - Confidential

MOVED Cr Nash.

1. *That:*

a. *under the provisions of Section 90(2) of the Local Government Act 1999 an order be made that the public be excluded from attendance at the meeting in order to consider in confidence this item.*

b. *the Council is satisfied that it is necessary that the public be excluded to enable the Council to discuss the matter at the meeting on the following grounds:*

Section 90(3)(e) matters affecting the security of the council, members or employees of the council, or council property; or the safety of any person;

The Council is satisfied that it is reasonably foreseeable that public disclosure of the information to be discussed at the meeting may result in vulnerabilities to the council's information technology network affecting the security of council property and the safety of employees and members of the public.

c. *accordingly, on this basis, the principle that meetings of the Council should be conducted in a place open to the public has been outweighed by the need to keep the information or discussion confidential.*

4. *That, pursuant to Section 91(9)(a) of the Local Government Act 1999, Council delegates the duty to conduct an annual review of the confidentiality order to the Chief Executive Officer, or their sub-delegate.*
5. *That, pursuant to Section 91(9)(c) of the Local Government Act 1999, Council delegates the power to revoke the confidentiality order to the Chief Executive Officer, or their sub-delegate.*
