Old Reynella former Winery Site Development Plan Amendment

The Environment Resources and Development Committee considered the Old Reynella Former Winery Site DPA.

In accordance with the provisions of section 27 (3) (a) of the *Development Act* 1993, the Committee, at its meeting on 15 June 2020, resolved that it did not object to the DPA.
